Activity based methods of teaching grammar such as game based teaching, exercises basedteaching etc., The difference between formal and functional grammar was taught and fewgrammar items such as tenses and verbs were demonstrated with the help of activities.

In the same way the various steps involved in teaching of poetry was handled in asession and the resource person demonstrated how to teach a poem following the varioussteps. Flipped classroom method was another way of helping students to learn in the 21<sup>st</sup>century and the various nuances of flipped classroom was taught to the students. The B.Ed.trainees of the institution demonstrated on how to prepare instructional material forteaching prose, poetry and grammar.



## Report on the Special Address on the 'Various Strategies to use in English classroom' 17-07-2018

ELT@I Thoothukudi Chapter has arranged a special address on Various Strategies to use in English classroom on 17.07.2018. The resource person was Dr.S.A.Thameemul Ansari, Professor of English, University of Jazan, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. # Workshop on 'Qualitative Methods in Educational Research' 12-08-2018

The workshop began with Tamil ThaiVazhthu. Dr. A. Joycilin Shermila, Principal of the college welcomed the gathering and introduced the resource person. The resource person was Dr. Srinivasan Kannan, Professor, Achutha Menon Centre for Health Science Studies, Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology, Tiruvanathapuram. The first session of the workshop was the icebreaker cum introduction session. The participants were divided into groups and asked to do any one of the following activities:

• Interview with the teachers and/or parents on the learning difficulties of children

• Focus group discussion on the difficulties faced by the teachers while managing the classroom

• Case study on the challenges faced by the teachers while managing personal and professional life

The participants introduced their partners and presented their work. The resource person gave his observations and this led to an understanding of the basic concepts in qualitative research.

The second session was on the different methods of qualitative research. Dr. Srinivasan Kannan explained methods like case study, interview, conversation analysis, participant observation, ethnography and content analysis. He explained the features of qualitative research and how they differ from quantitative research. The third session was on coding of qualitative data. Interview transcripts were given to the participants and they were asked to code them. The way of coding, categorizing, developing themes and theorizing was demonstrated. Writing of memos was also introduced. The participants coded the data and presented them. The codes of participants with the same data were compared. The final session was on reporting qualitative research. The steps of reporting were discussed at length. The workshop ended with feedback by two participants. The resource person shared his resources with the participants.

The workshop commenced with the prayer at 9.45am. The convener of the workshop Dr. Joycilin Shermila, Principal, Annammal College of Education for Women, Thoothukudi welcomed the gathering and inaugurated the workshop.

#### Day 1:

#### Session 1 Part 1:

The workshop began with session - 1 by Dr. P. N. Ramani on *Learner Autonomy–What, Why and How.* The resource person dealt with the year of origination of the concept of Learner Autonomy with its objective of shifting dependent learners to independent learners and critical thinkers followed by the responsibility, involvement and capability of autonomous language learners. The session dealt with few steps of the promotion of learner autonomy in language learning. Few classroom practices were introduced highlighting the learners' goal setting and teachers' role. At the end of the session the **Learner Autonomy Special Interest Group** of IATEFL was introduced.

#### Session 1 Part 2:

Session on Listening and Speaking Skills facilitated by Dr Revathy Viswanathan delivered on how an individualized instruction and learning can take place with the help of self instructional materials. Skills and strategies involved in autonomous listening and speaking were elaborated. The Terms SAC (Self Access Centre) was introduced.

#### **Session 2:**

Dr Xavier Pradheep Singh facilitated a session on **Writing Skills** through Collaborative Board Bulletin with an objective of including every learner in the learning process of preparing them for future jobs. He introduced Next Gen Z Learners, natural language processing and computational linguistics. Participants were trained to work with tools like Nearpod, Tricider, Padlet, Trello, Google Docs, and Grammarly.

#### **Session 3:**

Dr P. N. Ramani & Dr Revathy Viswanathan, in their session on **Reading Skill**, spoke on the basics of reading as a skill, the relationship between reading ability and learner autonomy and its concepts. Aspect of reading and its process with models were introduced with examples. A sample of measuring text difficulty and level of readability through Lexile software were given to check the level of students' reading skill to conduct the class activities accordingly.

#### Session 4:

Dr. M.S Xavier Pradheep Singh introduced resourceful websites on vocabulary such as visuwords, lexipedia, vocagrabber, lexical lab, your dictionary, lingro, word hippo, free collocation and vocabulary (as a tool) with its descriptions (as handout) and demonstration in detail. Participants were given time and guidance to work it out. Some web tools to expand vocabulary also were demonstrated. Dr. Ramani introduced some online resources on grammar.

#### Session 5:

Dr. M.S Xavier Pradheep Singh gave hands on experience on how to choose a course online and introduced few online learning platforms. And Dr. Revathy Viswanathan exposed the participants to lifelong learning. She introduced 10 lifelong learning skills with its benefits.
