The peer team verified the accuracy of the self-appraisal report submitted to NACC and also interacted with the various constituents of our college and conferred 'A' Grade to the institution. The Re-accreditation was held on November 30 and December 1, 2012 and the college was conferred with 'B' Grade.

Brief History of the College

Annammal College of Education was founded in 1962 by Thiru. AR.A.S. Arumugasamy Nadar, (1893 - 1971) the eldest and illustrious son of the founder of the Subbiah Dharmanidhi, Thiru. AR.A. Subbiah Nadar (1871-1943) with the noble ideal of imparting training to graduates among women to become able and talented teachers. The college bears the name of his beloved and benign mother Thirumathi Annammal. Thiru. D. Shenbagamurthi (1921 - 1986) who succeeded his uncle in 1968, brought glory to the Trust and College by his selfless and devoted work. Constructing the College and hostel buildings in the new picturesque location on the Tiruchendur Road had always been a dream to him. This dream had come true on 31st January 1993 when the new College and hostel buildings were declared open by Thiru. G.K. Moopanar.

Thiru. S. Gauthaman, succeeded his father as secretary of the college from 1986-1993. Thiru. D. Shunmugam (1993 - 2010), took over charge from 1993 as the secretary. He joined hands with Thiru. D. Ganesan, the president of the Subbiah Dharmanidhi trust in making the college a techno park in its infrastructure. They worked for continuous improvement and updation of teaching facilities and resources at all levels.

Thiru. D. Ganesan is the present Secretary of the college. His commitment to quality is always unflinching.

The College was affiliated in 1962 to the Madras University and then from 1966 to Madurai Kamarajar University and since 1990 to the Manonmaniam Sundaranar University at Tirunelveli. Since 2008 the college is affiliated to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, Chennai. The College has been granted recognition by the National Council for Teacher Education since 1996.

The College offers a one year teacher training course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Education and a one year course in Master of Education.

The M.Ed. course was commenced in the year 1994-95. It was affiliated to Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli. From the year 2008, it was affiliated to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University (TNTEU), Chennai. At present, we have an intake of 50 students.

From 2000 to 2009 the college offered PGDCA Course affiliated to the Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli.

The syndicate of TNTEU has granted recognition to our college to offer research leading to M.Phil. degree from the academic year 2014-2015. The college will admit 20 students in part - time / full - time basis.

The college is the study centre for Indira Gandhi National Open University B.Ed programme since 2008. The National Testing Service, India, Centre for Testing and Evaluation, Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL), Mysore has established a Regional Field Unit Centre (RFU) at our college since 2009.

The College has a Network Resource Centre equipped with modern computer system with Local Area Network and Multimedia. A very wide range of facilities exist for extra curricular activities - games & sports, social work & community service clubs, road safety patrols, students' union, Science Club, English Club, Health Club, Research Club, Maths Club, Eco Club, History Club, IT Club, Red Ribbon Club, Tamil Manram, Rotaract Club etc., for the total development of the students.

Right from the inception, erudite scholars and able administrators have served as Principals and held aloft the flag of the College. The College also has a team of talented and devoted faculty. The results in the University Examinations have been consistently good and the College has carved a niche for itself in the field of teacher education in Tamil Nadu.

Managing Trustees

AR.A. SUBBIAH NADAR (1934-1943) migrated from Sivakasi to Thoothukudi and came up in life through hard work, business integrity, shrewd commercial insight, and above all an abiding faith in the Supreme Guide. Subbiah Dharmanidhi was founded in 1934 by his boundless munificence to cater to the growing needs of education and religious charities.

AR.A.S. ARUMUGASAMY NADAR (1943-55 & 1957-68) the eldest and illustrious son of the founder, established in 1962 Annammal College of Education with the noble ideal of imparting training to the graduates among women of the southern districts to become able and talented teachers. The newly constructed hostel aptly named after him on his centenary year - 1993, will stand as a fine monument to the memory of this great man.

AR.A.S. DURAISAMY NADAR (1955-1957) joined the freedom struggle in 1935 and participated in the Quit India Movement. He was a member of the Madras Legislative Assembly, between 1937 and 1938 representing Srivaikuntam Constituency. He managed well the educational institutions of the Trust.

DURAISAMY SHENBAGAMURTHI (1968-1986) succeeded his uncle in 1968, and brought glory to the Trust and the College by his devoted work. Constructing the college and hostel buildings in the new site on the Tiruchendur Road had always been a dream to him and it is gratifying for his successor to have made it come true.

DURAISAMY GANESAN (from 1986) has completed in 1993 the construction of the College and Hostel buildings for Annammal College of Education for Women. In 1994 he had fully renovated the premises in Big Street, Tiruvannamalai which resulted in additional income to the Trust. He has built, in 1995 an airconditioned Computer Laboratory in Subbiah Vidyalayam and in 1996 the Sri Vidya Ganapathi Shrine at the entrance to the school. He has constructed in 1996 at Subbiah Vidyalayam, the Golden Jubilee Building which houses the Science Laboratories, Library, Music Rooms and the Higher Secondary Classes. In 1997 a Hi-tech Rest Room of international standard was constructed for the benefit of the students. Sri Siddhi Vinayagar Temple constructed in 1911 by the founder of the Trust was fully renovated and the Kumbabishekam was conducted on 14-04-1999. In 2000 a building to house the Sports, NCC, Indoor Games and a Gym, was constructed. The same year the Stage in the auditorium was fully renovated and an excellent Acoustic System was installed. A new Bus and a A

water Tanker were procured for use of the school and college. In 2001, the construction of the Millennium 2000 Building to house the Office, Headmistress, Staff & Management rooms and the High School classes was completed. The work of doubling the size of the indoor auditorium was again completed in 2001. A Tuck Shop, Nadana Arangam, Green Room and Plaza were added during the same year. He had constructed in 2001, an architecturally designed Ninaivalayam for the founder of the Trust on Polur Road at Tiruvannamalai.

The college is marching in step with times with the introduction of modern state of art facilities in the college. Renovation and Computerization of the Principal's Room, Office Room, Library and refurbishing staff room were the landmarks set through meticulous planning.

Driven by his insatiable thirst for making true the vision of his ancestors, Shri D. Ganesan continues to add glory to the existing infrastructure of our college. Refurbishing stage 'Dimple' in the hostel quadrangle, renovation and expansion of dining hall and store room, modernised see through kitchen with steam cooking facilities and Bain Marie counter, home theatre television in dining hall, refurbished fitness center, galleried class rooms in the first floor and construction of high-tech added browsing center & ACE Mart are the additions made recently to our campus. An annexure to the hostel partly aided by UGC, has been constructed in 2006.

Construction of new building named Diamond Jubilee building in Subbiah Vidyalayam to house the Tamil Medium Kindergarten and Primary classes were completed in June 2010. The construction of Subbiah Vidyalayam Kindergarten classes in English Medium on the Nanthavanam land has been completed and inaugurated on 28.9.2009. The Middle School was merged into the Higher Secondary School at the beginning of the academic year 2010-2011 for better management.

Biometric attendance for both teaching and non teaching staff was introduced from 2009-2010 both at college and at school. Four Galleried Classrooms in the first floor, with LCD Projector facilities in each are a special feature of hi-tech classrooms. The 'National Testing Service' Regional Field Unit (RFU) Hall and IGNOU Study Centre Hall were both airconditioned, renovated and modernized as part of the extension activity with complete facilities. A mini forest environment in the campus has been set up by planting every year, trees of special and rare species.

Construction of second floor in both the new and old hostels in ACE, which is partly funded by UGC under X plan, has been completed in 2011. A new Hi-tech, air-conditioned, Network Resource Centre (NRC) with 61 computers and with Broadband internet connections, which is partly funded by UGC was opened in 2011. A Physical Science lab, a Biological Science lab and 15 classrooms both in the first and second floor were added to the existing infrastructure facilities during 2011. A modern Student's Restroom with 16 cubicles has been installed.

A DELL Computer was installed for editing video programmes and short films. Three Water Doctor Purifiers were installed in each floor in the hostel to ensure the health of the student residents and a Grunfos Pressure Pump for supply of water even at the second floor at 3 Bar pressure.

As a part of expansion and modernization of our college infrastructure, the construction of the following buildings were completed during 2011- 2012 for making our institution an ideal and unique one. A modern digital, air-conditioned, library with mezzanine floor on the second floor, an additional Guest room, a Day care centre and a Basketball court near hostel has been completed during 2012-13. A gas Incinerator at the hostel and electric Napkin Incinerator at the college was installed to ensure hygiene of the women students.

Equipments worth Rs. 31 lakhs has been added to Audio Visual Department during 2011-2012 with special mention to 7 LCD projectors, 3 Laptops, Sony Camcorder, mixer and HD public address system.

UGC grants under various schemes were allocated under XI plan for Under-Graduate building assistance for construction of additional class rooms, for purchasing equipments, for developing the sports infrastructure and purchase of sports equipments.

UGC grants under XI plan Merged scheme (14 schemes) were utilized for Rejuvenation of infrastructure facilities, to furnish the new library and update with books and journals, Career & Counselling Cell, Coaching for NET, Remedial coaching & Coaching classes for entry in service for SC/ST/OBC & minorities.

The milestones stepped in the year of 2012-2013 are the refurbishing of Air-conditioned 'Speak English Corner' in the ground floor to develop spoken English, Installation of 'Smart Board' in the second floor, modernizing and furnishing of the Sports room, installation of 125 KVA (1 KW Cummins Diesel) Power Generator with automatic switch on and off to provide continuous power supply both at college and hostel, Renovation and modernization of Shenbagamurthi lecture hall with provision of Rs. 86000 worth good acoustic Speakers, Installation of double-sided metal shelves imported from Malaysia for Library, Physical Science and Biological Science Labs and Renovation of Old Lab in the ground floor to house IQAC.

'UGC Adhoc grants' worth 1.5 lakhs were utilized to purchase library books through online book store 'Sogosmos.com' and 'XII plan UGC grant' of Rs. 1.25 lakhs were used to purchase books at the Chennai Book fare. UGC grants for equipments worth Rs. 3.5 lakhs were used to purchase 'Podium' and 'Speakers JBL EON' for classrooms.

Our college has received the following UGC Grants during the academic year 2013-14. 'Adhoc on Account Grant' for 3 lakhs and a second instalment of Rs.1 lakh 80 thousand under the scheme of 'Under-Graduate Development Assistance' during XII plan period for Books, Journals and Equipments. A second instalment of UGC grant Rs.22.5 Lakhs has been received under the scheme of 'Additional Assistance to colleges already included under 12B' during XII plan to purchase equipments. Rs.3,00,000/- have been received under the scheme of 'Establishment and Monitoring of the Internal Quality Assurance Cells (IQACs) in colleges during XII plan period'. Rs.11,85,936/- has been allocated and sanctioned under the scheme of Plan Block Grant (PBG) during XII plan period.

During 2013-14, the Audio Visual Equipments room was furnished with airconditioner. The ground floor verandah was renovated with tiles.

During 2014-15, the laying of interlock pavement from entrance of the college campus and two wheeler parking is completed.

Rules and Regulations for Students

Attendance

Attendance in the college is compulsory. A student must put in a minimum of 85% attendance to be eligible for the TNTEU degree examinations. The absence of a student for any single hour in a session in a day would result in the loss of attendance for half a day.

The duration of the B.Ed. and M.Ed. course shall be for one academic year consisting of 200 working days /curriculum transaction days.

It is strictly instructed that the students who do not earn required attendance will not be permitted to write the university examination.

Internal marks will not be given for students who have shortage of attendance. Such students have to repeat the course by rejoining afresh at the succeeding years, if they wish to complete the B.Ed / M.Ed degree course.

Conduct

Every student should be dressed modestly and decently. Students are required to help in keeping the college campus and the classroom clean and tidy. With a view to bring about intimate association between students and teachers, each student is assigned to a member of the teaching staff who will be her tutor for guidance and counselling. Students are not allowed to bring Cellphones to their classroom.

Campus facilities and student amenities

In order to facilitate better learning the college has provision for Multi Media Projectors with Note Book Computers, a Network Resource Centre equipped with latest software in the field of education and internet with browsing facilities open to the students. The classrooms are provided with LCD Projectors, and perfect acoustic systems. To facilitate the young teachers to the modern trends in teaching, annual seminars and workshops in each subject are arranged and eminent scholars and experts in each field participate in them. The college is proud of its state of the art lecture halls fitted with the latest electronic systems. The college owns 3 buses for transporting the trainees during the intensive training programmes and field trips. A tanker lorry is also provided to bring fresh water from Pudukkottai for college use.

D.Arunachalam Library

Perfect silence should be observed in the library.

Except on Sunday and other Public holidays library would be kept open on all the other days from 9.30 a.m to 5.30 p.m.

Students will be allowed to borrow two books at a time for a period of one week.

If the book is not returned on due date, a fine of Rs. 1/-is collected per day.

Marking in books or writing in them is strictly forbidden.

A book lost or damaged shall be replaced by a new copy of the same book within a month from the due date by the borrower.

A book may be renewed for a second time provided no other application for the book is pending.

Reference books can be consulted only in the library.

All books must be returned for annual stock taking

Students are advised to contact the Librarian for any assistance.

Fee Concessions and Scholarships

Fee Concessions - 92 T.N.E.R.

Students belonging to SC & ST (including converts) are eligible for award of full fee concession if they produce a Community Certificate from Tahsildar.

Freedom Fighter's Children Scholarships

Students whose parents have participated in the Freedom struggle of India and have undergone a minimum three months imprisonment are eligible for the award of this scholarship.

Adi Dravida Welfare Scholarships

Adi Dravida Welfare scholarships of the Tamilnadu State Government are granted as per government norms. Students whose parents have an annual income below Rs.2,50,000/- are eligible for scholarship.

Backward Class Scholarships

Residential and Non Residential scholarships for the B.C, MBC and DNT students sanctioned by the Backward class Department of the Tamilnadu State Government are granted as per government norms. Students whose parents have an annual income below Rs.2,00,000/- are eligible for scholarship.

Uzhavar Scholarships

Uzhavar scholarship of Tamilnadu State Government is granted as per Government norms. Other scholarship holders need not apply for this scholarship.

Special Features

NETWORK RESOURCE CENTRE (NRC)

To keep abreast with the changing scenario in higher education, employment and research a Network Resource Centre (NRC) is set up in the campus. The main objective of the NRC is to create awareness and give exposure to teacher educators and student teachers about the use of computer. Our NRC has free and round the clock broad band internet facility, accessible to all student teachers, M.Ed students and teacher educators with 61 terminals, without any time restriction to carry out their practicum activities like presentations and dissertation work to fruition. The multimedia set up in our NRC helps to integrate ICT in our teaching and learning process.

A computer course designed by our teacher educators provides the students a basic knowledge on the operational use of computers and the internet. Surfing skills of students are developed through practical training sessions in our NRC. The students are also taught to use search engines to download e-resources for their assignments and reference work.

Special Coaching

UGC- NET Coaching and JRF eligibility for M.Ed. students

The National Educational Testing Bureau of University Grants Commission (UGC) conducts National Eligibility Test (NET) to determine eligibility for lectureship and for award of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in order to ensure minimum standards for the entrants in the teaching profession and research. The tests are conducted twice in a year, in the months of June and December. The JRFs are awarded to the meritorious candidates from among the candidates qualifying for eligibility for lectureship in the NET. JRFs are available only to the candidates who opt for it in their application forms.

NET is an added advantage to any student who completes Masters Degree in Education with 55% and above. A Pass in UGC-NET Examination is the basic requirement of lectureship in Colleges of Education. Hence we offer UGC-NET Coaching in our institution from 2002-2003, to enhance the employability of our M.Ed. students. We provide quality study materials to our students for UGC-NET examination.

TNTET Coaching for B.Ed. and M.Ed. students

TNTET is an eligibility test conducted by Teachers Recruitment Board to check the eligibility of candidates for the post of teachers. TNTET Coaching Classes are offered to the B.Ed. and M.Ed. students to enhance the employability of our students. The classes are handled by our faculty based on their subject specialisation.

Extension Programmes

Indira Gandhi National Open University B.Ed. Programme

Indira Gandhi National Open University B.Ed. Study Centre Programme of our College was initiated on 01.04.08. Our college provides the opportunity of developing the understanding and competencies required for working and practicing teachers in a distant mode, thereby improving their teaching learning processes at the secondary stage.

The following certificate programmes are also offered at our Programme Study Centre :

1. Certificate in Teaching of English as a Second Language (CTE)
2. Certificate Programme in Value Education (CPVE)
3. Certificate in Guidance and Counselling (CIG)
4. Certificate in Appreciation Course on Environment (ACE)

Academic counsellors of our centre conduct counselling sessions and practicum related work for the programme.

Computer Course

The world is in a digital age where computer is applied in every sector of human endeavour. The prospective teachers of Annammal College are imparted with the basic computer skills through the General Computer Classes everyday from 9.00 a.m. to 9.45 a.m.

Spoken English Centre

The trainees of Annammal College of Education come from heterogeneous backgrounds. Many of them have their school education in vernacular medium and have limited exposure to English. To develop the spoken English of the trainees we have developed a Spoken English Training Centre. Our faculty members train the students in spoken English on a regular basis. All the students are given opportunity to make use of the Spoken English Centre to become fluent speakers of English.

Fingering Practice

The prospective teachers of Annammal College of Education are given fingering practice on a regular basis using typewriter. It enables the students to memorize the keyboard and create a mental map of the associated fingers.

Students' Hostel

AR.A.S.Arumugasamy Nadar Hall

GENERAL RULES

- Students are advised not to bring costly articles and ornaments to the hostel.
- Visitors are allowed only on second Saturdays and Sundays.
- Visitors are not allowed to enter the hostel premises.
- Students are responsible for the furniture and fittings allotted to them. If any damage is caused, cost of the same will be recovered from the concerned student.
- The inmates are provided with well furnished rooms and they are directed to keep the rooms clean and tidy.
- Students should be punctual for all the activities of the hostel, meals, prayer, games etc.,.
- For the sake of entertainment a LCD Television is installed in the Dining hall and the residents can use it with prior permission from the Deputy warden.
- A Fitness Centre (Gymnasium) is installed in the hostel for the benefit of the residents.
- The inmates are provided with STD facilities in the hostel premises. They are advised to use it between 6.00 a.m. and 8.15 a.m. & 4.30 p.m. and 10.30 p.m. on all working days and 6.00 a.m. and 10.30 p.m. on holidays.

REGULATIONS

1. The inmates are not permitted to leave the hostel for weekends and on short holidays.
2. Inmates should get prior permission in writing from the Warden to go out for local visits with their parents or guardians.
3. Hostelites should sign the outdoor visiting register which is kept in the Deputy Warden's room if they are given permission to go out either for local visit or for any other reason.
4. Out going mail should be deposited in the special Post Box kept in the hostel.
5. All the students are expected to maintain the bathroom, the mirrors, Washbasins and all other general utilities clean and tidy. Wastes like soap covers etc., are to be deposited in the dust bins kept in the toilet area. Bindis are not to be stuck on the walls or mirrors in the toilet area. Wastage of water and electrical power to be avoided.

6. Disposal of the sanitary towels, napkins of the inmates should be done in the specially provided bins in the specific toilets. They are not to be disposed anywhere else.
7. Establishment charges, which is also on dividing basis includes electricity & water charges, salary for staff and servants employed, telephone rent, maintenance cost of electric motor, generator, fans and pipes, electrical fittings and kitchen materials etc.
8. The mess fees should be paid every month at the Hostel office one week after the publishing of mess rates by the Deputy Warden.
9. The inmates are advised to deposit the room keys at 8-30 a.m. every day in the Hostel Office before they leave for the college.

MESS

1. Dividing system will be followed and no rebates will be allowed.
2. Milk, egg and Non Vegetarian item may be taken extra if the student so desires and the cost has to be paid separately.
3. Students are not permitted to enter the kitchen.
4. The inmates are expected to be in the dining hall as soon as the bell rings.
5. Only the required amount of food should be taken in the plate and wastage of food must be avoided.
6. Food on any account should not be carried to the hostel rooms.

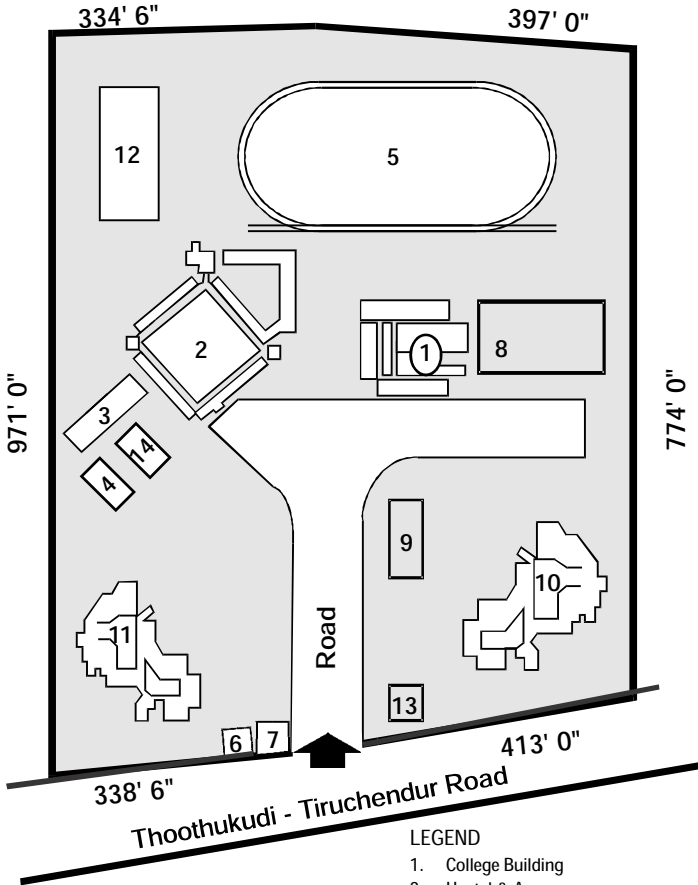
